This master-class is addressed to archivists, curators, private collectors and professionals in the field of conservation and preservation. Participants will learn about the history and technology of the main historical silver printing processes. Conservation issues will be discussed, as well as the correct guidelines for the handling and long term preservation of these photographic materials. The lectures will be supplemented and enhanced by practical sessions, during which some important preservation issues will be discussed and participants will acquire various skills such as identifying photographic artefacts using hand-held microscopes.
